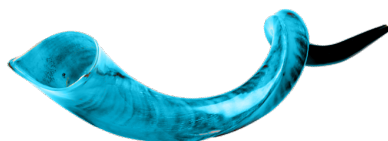

PARASHAT DEVARIM - SHABBAT HAZON

Torah (Deuteronomy 1:1 - 3:22): Etz Hayim p. 981 - 998

Haftarah (Isaiah 1:1 - 1:27): Etz Hayim p. 999 - 1004

TORAH PORTION SUMMARY

In this Torah portion, Moses recounts the Israelites' episodes from their 40 years in the wilderness. Moses encourages the Israelites in their upcoming conquest of the land of Canaan.

HAFTORAH PORTION SUMMARY

Isaiah reminds the people that God has been like a father to them, and instead of being grateful and respectful for all that God has done for them, the people continue to rebel and spurn God's authority. Isaiah tells the people that God no longer has any interest in the sacrifices that the people have been bringing to Him. Though they obediently gather in the Temple on holidays and at the beginning of every month, their lack of social justice nullifies any reward they may get for offering gifts to God.

As the haftarah progresses, Isaiah's rage wanes slightly. He tells the people to change their behavior and promises that they will be rewarded with a bountiful harvest. In the closing section of the haftarah, Isaiah laments the downfall of Judah and Jerusalem, the destitution of Zion, and the injustice that is rampant.
